

#### Looking Ahead to the Holidays & New Year!

Our readers will be happy that this article will not urge them to prepare, prepare, prepare!!!!! We know that can be annoying. However, we feel it is important enough to incur the wrath of some people. This is expected as 'part of our job' as our Team has been tasked by the HOA with providing information and assistance to all our residents. We understand that not everyone wants this level of assistance and that most of you are fully capable of doing this on your own. However, the HOA Board has created this Team / Committee to do its best to provide information and assistance to everyone at the very reasonable cost of: **FREE TO LHV RESIDENTS!** The Team appreciates the support of the Board and most of our residents, many who have been very complimentary to the Team. The last Team meeting of 2023 was held on October 19<sup>th</sup>. However, if there is a storm alert the Team will meet according to the overall plan. For me, the best part of all this is the **Team Members / Residents helping their neighbors! These are your neighbors and friends who really care about you and your safety.** 

So, what is next for the Team in 2024? Here are some thoughts:

- \* HOA Board elections are coming up. We have been very fortunate to have a wonderful Board! Each year there are members leaving and new members joining. Be sure to thank the current Board for all they do and be sure to vote in this important election. Regarding the Team, the Board has been absolutely fantastic in their support! We thank all of them. The Team is also fortunate to have three of our members who also serve as Board Members. Special thanks and recognition to **Wanda Stanley**, **Matt Rice**, and **Bill Davis!** Also, special thanks to **Clark Smith**, who has been a strong advocate and was always there to help with anything we needed!
- \* The new HOA Board will decide on whether to continue the Team / Committee for 2024. These decisions are usually made in February, after the new Board is finalized and officers are elected.
- \* In 2023 the Team received good feedback for participation (having a table / exhibit) at the **March Vendor Fair**. The Team discussed this and felt this would be a good yearly event, subject to the HOA and space available, etc.
- In 2023 the Team sponsored an 'Open House' event on June 1st, the first day of hurricane season. The Team had speakers, refreshments, give aways, etc., but <u>only about fifty-four (54) people attended</u>. This was disappointing to many of us. Though the Team worked hard to plan and implement this, there is concern that, despite a good program, there is a lack of interest. This is something to be considered by the HOA Board in 2024.
- \* Volunteers are the heart and soul of our Team! All Team members are volunteers. In 2023 the Team had a shortage of volunteers to help in each zone. There is also a need for people to work behind the scenes, to make phone calls, do 'check ins' with our handicapped residents, update lists, etc. There is no required time commitment. Even if you can spare one hour each month, it will help ease the burden of others. Also, many of our Team volunteers are also active in other activities and their time is limited. If you are interested in helping, talk with one of the members listed below.

This will be my last Gator Tales article for the HOA Emergency Preparedness Team. I hope that the information provided during this year was helpful. As mentioned previously, the HOA Board will decide on whether to continue the Team / Committee for 2024, set goals, provide, oversight, and appoint members as they see fit. It has been a privilege to coordinate this effort for 2023. As with many things in life, there were good things done and there were things that could have been done better. We have continued to learn from our experiences. The key to a group like our Team is its dedicated members. These individuals have all given their time over the past eight months (at least!) to attend meetings, plan events, give out information packets, be prepared, talk with neighbors, and perform the intangibles of being a great neighbor to all our LHV residents! #### Suspicious minds save lives

The 9/11 attacks in the Unites States and the recent terrorists attacks on Israel are both similar in the way that citizens were caught off guard.

Hopefully, we will never see anything like that happen again anywhere, but honesty, it could happen again, and it could even happen here. Remember, the terrorist who flew the planes on 9/11 took flying lessons here in Florida, and the suspicious part of their actions was that they were only concerned with learning take-offs, they weren't interested in learning how to land a plane.

You know I love to say, "If you see something, say something." So many crimes could be prevented, stopped, or solved by witnesses simply notifying law enforcement immediately when something suspicious occurs. And yes, that even includes acts of terrorism.

Recently Florida Attorney General Ashley Moudy, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, and others teamed—up to urge Floridians to speak-up when they witness suspicious activity. If you see something, hear about something, or you know about something, report it immediately.


Some examples are vehicles parked in odd or prohibited places, unattended boxes, backpacks or luggage: damages to security cameras, or someone purchasing a large number of cell phones.

Try to provide as much information as you can and call it in statewide to 855-FLA-SAFE.

And of course, you can always call the Polk County Sheriff's Office to report suspicious activity. Depending on the severity of the situation, you can call the non-emergency numbrt at 863-298-6200, or for something that is more urgent, call 9-1-1.

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
