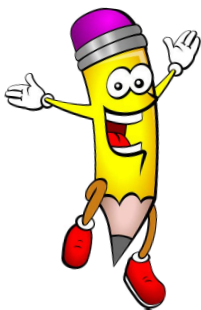

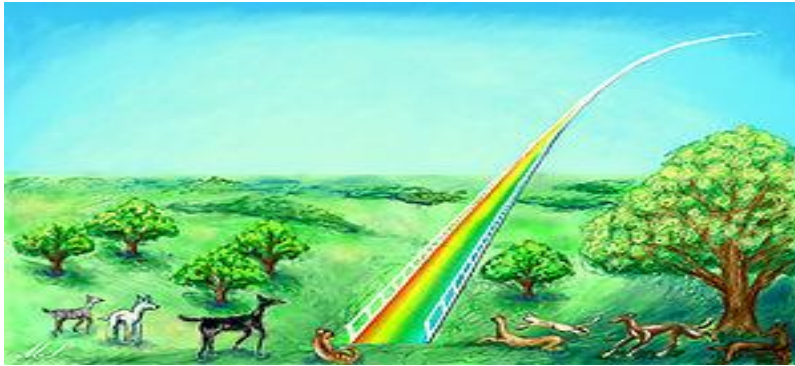

# The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team - Looking Ahead for 2023

Last month we reviewed the activities of the HOA Emergency Preparedness Team in 2022. During 2022, the Team worked diligently to help residents be prepared. The Team believes that its efforts helped to increase awareness and encourage residents to be better prepared for the storms that we know will eventually come. In 2022 all of us were challenged by not one but two storms! As we stated last month, overall LHV did very well. In 2023 the Team hopes to do even more to help prepare for these events of nature.

By the time you read this, the Homeowners Association (HOA) held its Annual Meeting on January 17th. At that time newly elected Board Members joined the existing Board, comprising a **'new' Board** which has begun its work. The **HOA Emergency Preparedness Team** was created by the HOA Board in 2018 and is considered a standing committee.

## Next Steps:

- ✓ At the February HOA Meeting a sign-up sheet will be available for anyone who might be interested in becoming a member of the Team.
- ✓ An organizational meeting will later be scheduled for anyone interested in attending and learning more.
- ✓ The Board will appoint someone as chair or coordinator to follow up. This may or may not be a Board member. The process is up to the new Board.

## Possible 2023 Team Events & Activities:

- ✓ The 2022 Team decided that the **Team should have a booth / table / exhibit at the annual Vendor Fair in March**. Joyce Middleton, coordinator of the Vendor Fair, has offered the Team a space at the fair, details to be worked out.
- ✓ The Team hopes to obtain **2023 Shelter Maps and other materials** and arrange for distribution prior to June 1<sup>st</sup>. This will be done by 'Zone Representatives' delivering the material to each resident personally. The Team may need to meet to plan these events in detail.
- ✓ A **Hurricane Open House** on or about June 1<sup>st</sup> similar to last year's but with improvements, to be decided by the team with participation of the Board.
- ✓ A possible **'Mid-Hurricane Event'** around September 1<sup>st</sup>, to be decided by the Team.
- ✓ We hope to continue **monthly Team articles in Gator Tales** assuming we have volunteers who would like to work on this ongoing project.
- ✓ A **'Generator Subcommittee'** has been proposed to organize a system for helping those without generators. Last year an informal network led by Kathy and Dan Deuel provided a place to cook and serve food during power outages. There is great interest in this!
- ✓ Lots, lots more!!!! We can do more with your help!

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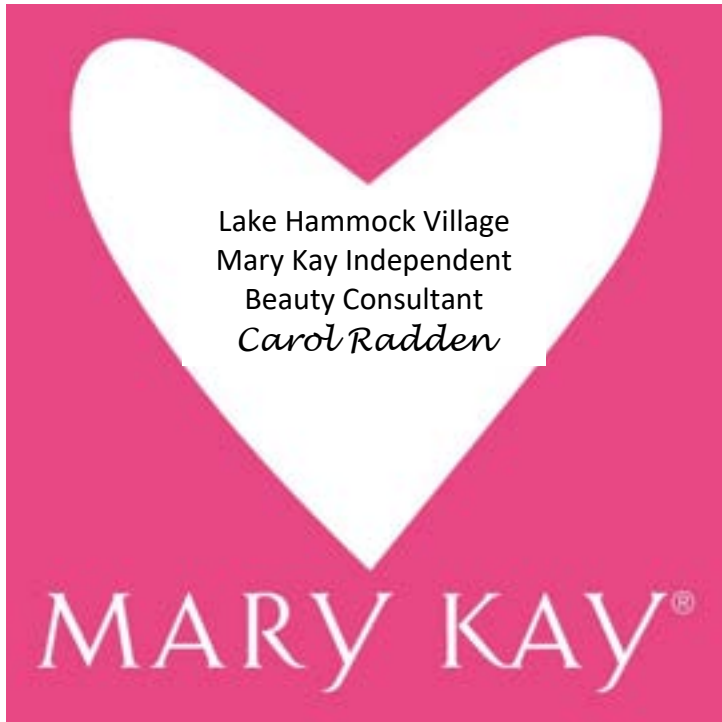
