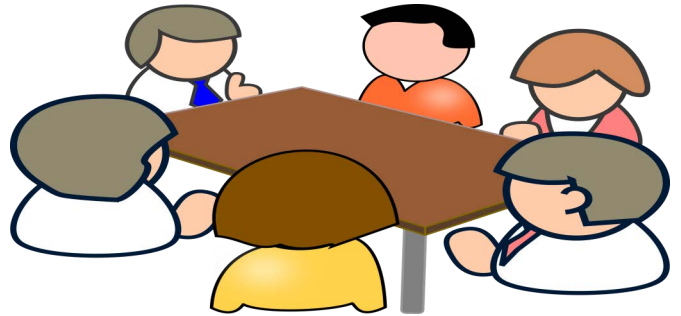

Book Club



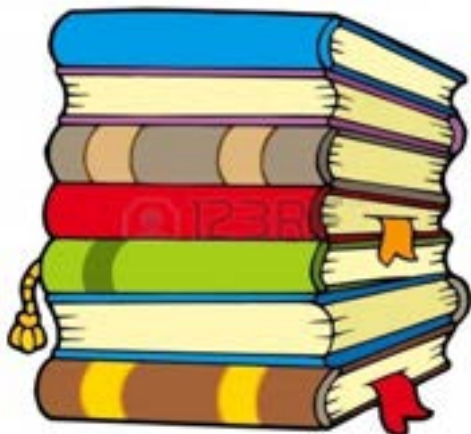
Book club is starting up again in January 2024.

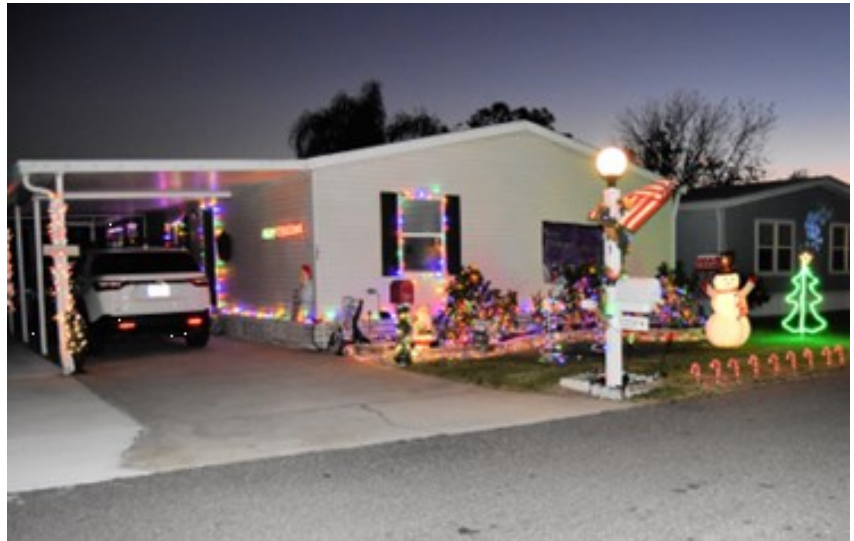

The scam that just won't go away

From time to time, I will share with you information regarding current scams that you need to be aware of and avoid. In this particular case, this is a scam I have mentioned in the past, but won't go away. And unfortunately, there are still people falling for it.

I'm talking about the **jury duty scam**.

The way this usually works is that you will receive a call from someone telling you they work for a law enforcement agency or court, and you are facing arrest, because you have failed to report for jury duty and now there is a warrant issued. And of course, there's a money angle to it—there always is with these scammers. They'll usually tell you that if you pay a fine, the warrant will be voided.

That's the vague explanation of it, but we have heard of some scammers using names of real employees of the Polk County Sheriff's Office. Sometimes, they even can make your caller ID show that the number is coming from the Sheriff's Office, even though it isn't. They might even give you a phone number to call, and when it is answered (usually a recording) it says you have reached the Sheriff's Office.

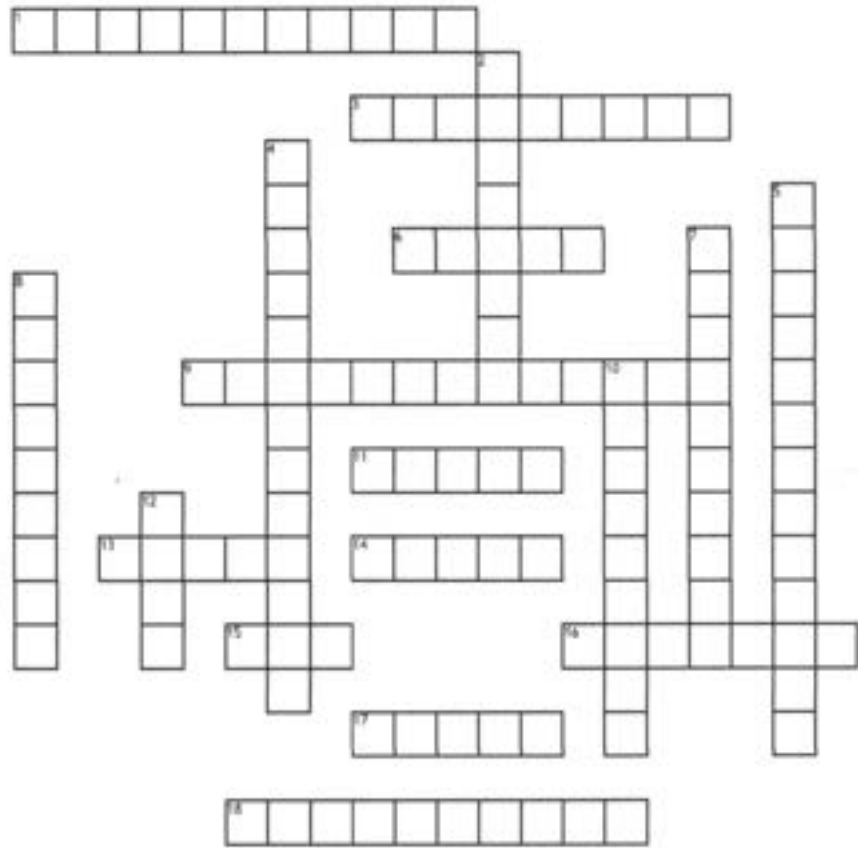
Scammers are fast talkers who give you a lot of information all at once. They do that to confuse you, to cause you to panic, and make you more agreeable.

If you suspect you're being scammed, but aren't sure, slow the person down. Tell them you need to verify who they say they are. Get their name and say you're going to call the PCSO back and ask for them – they are not going to like that. They will tell you that you can't do it that way. You can simply verify it by calling the PCSO at (863) 298-6200 (non-emergency #) and tell them you think you are being scammed.

The Sheriff's Office does not accept money to close out a warrant, speeding tickets, or fines, **EVER!** The Clerk of the Courts handles all fines, tracking, and Jury Duty responsibilities, and neither they nor the PCSO will call you about it.

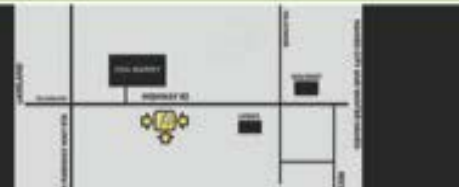
