Preparing for Hurricane Season 2023:

Utilize Available Resources, Think Ahead, Make a Plan & Do it Now!

The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team for Gator Tales June 2023

Hurricane season is now here. We are now faced with the next six months of weather watches, planning, and a general feeling of anxiety. June 1st triggers this yearly ritual. The peak months for hurricane activity have historically been August and September, but one never knows. Last year an unexpected November storm came our way and reminded us that hurricanes can come at us at any time.

How do we respond to this ongoing challenge? The best advice is **BE PREPARED!** Although we can't control the weather, there are things we can do to prepare for hurricane season. Now is the time to look seriously at making necessary preparations and develop a plan for yourself.

The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team is here to help you, but each of us has the primary responsibility to prepare ourselves. We suggest that you prepare as if your life may depend on your level of preparation. In 2022 residents did a good job preparing. Our recommendation is to hope for the best, plan for the worst, **but....**START PLANNING – DO NOT PROCRASTINATE – this is too important! The Team recommends:

Utilize Available Resources:

- 1. As we have noted in previous articles, the Team has divided LHV into Eight Zones. A map of these zones is included in this edition and a large copy is posted on the Team Bulletin Board at the Clubhouse.
- 2. We have dedicated volunteers in each zone. It is likely that the volunteers in each zone know the individuals within. Often, they are your neighbors and friends. They are there to help you ask them questions or for help. If they can't help, someone on the Team will be able to help or have an answer. So, get to know your **Zone Volunteers! The Team would like to have more than one contact person in each zone. If you are interested, please let us know.**
- 3. On <u>Thursday, June 1st</u> the Team will be holding an informal <u>Hurricane Season Open House from Noon to 4:00 PM at the Clubhouse</u>. This is for everyone, whether you are a snowbird or full-time resident. If you are one of our new residents this would be a great time to learn more about hurricane preparation and to meet your fellow residents. We will have speakers and representatives from Polk County Emergency Management our Lead Speaker Jerri Kaplan will lead off at noon. Energy, Polk Sheriff's Office, Haines City Police Department, and other City Police Departments, and others, will be available. We will also have videos and demonstrations. We hope you will come. Refreshments will be available. This is an opportunity to meet Team Members in an informal setting, learn about the LHV-HOA, talk with the Zone Coordinator(s) for your area, ask questions to Team Members, etc. Please consider attending!

- 4. The Team will be providing Hurricane Information Packets to all residents. Some of this will be provided at the Open House. For those not attending, we will get the information to you. These packets include the new 2023 Shelter Maps, information about planning, and other helpful materials. As we have pointed out previously, the Shelter Map itself contains a wealth of information including putting together a 7 Day Survival Kit, information on the Polk County Special Needs Program, a listing of Pet Friendly Shelters, and important telephone numbers and emergency information numbers. We also hope to have the 2023 Spectrum Hurricane Preparedness Guide as part of this package. (Since this article is submitted before May 20th we do not know for sure when we will receive them, but once we do, you will get a copy.)
- 5. The Team is working on more informational resources for you. Our <u>Hotel List 2022</u> is available (and we hope to update it for 2023). This includes information on local hotels, hotel and motel chains, information on pet friendly ones, and telephone numbers to utilize to find additional information or make reservations. This list is available from the Team by request and may help in determining your best options for evacuation when a hurricane threatens.
- 6. **List of Generators:** This is currently being updated and should be available soon. **For those of you who need to refrigerate medication**, some very generous residents have offered the use of their facilities to store it if we lose power. If you need this, please let a Team Member know and we will put you in touch with one of our generous families. **Additional information will be available soon.**
- 7. **Team Volunteers Our Greatest Resource!** We can help. All you need to do is ask. We can't do the planning for you, but we can all be resources for each other.

Think Ahead:

- 1. Shop for items such as water, batteries, canned goods, etc. Make sure your car is gassed up, and gas grille propane tank is full, etc.
- 2. We have made recommendations in the past. Today is the time to follow through. Tomorrow it may be too late when a storm is heading our way.

Make a Plan & Do it Now!

- 1. Take the time to think about what you would do when a storm is coming your way. This is so important. Would you plan to stay at LHV? If so, are your windows and doors in good shape? What if you have a pet? Some of you may have family or friends, but some do not. How about hotels and motels? Do they take pets? Is there a 'Pet Fee?' (Many charge extra for pets).
- 2. If you or any of your neighbors need help, please let a member know!
- 3. **The Special Needs** Program is available for those with **severe conditions.** HOWEVER, there is a registration process which needs to be completed so the Polk County Emergency Operations Center can help you. We can answer questions and help you apply.

Remember, we are all residents and volunteers! We can work together to keep each other safe!

The goals of the Team are to help each other, to keep our residents safe, and to try to assist everyone to be better prepared in times of hurricane threats.


