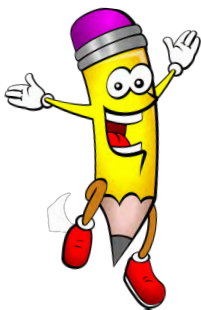

# In the Know...



## Ancient History of Ireland

**The first humans arrived in Ireland between 7,000 and 6,000 BC after the end of the last ice age. The first Irish people lived by farming, fishing, and gathering food such as plants and shellfish. The Stone Age hunters tended to live on the seashore or on the banks of rivers and lakes where food was plentiful. They hunted animals like deer and wild boar. They also hunted birds and they hunted seals with harpoons.**

**About 4,000 BC farming was introduced to Ireland. The Stone Age farmers kept sheep, pigs, and cattle and raised crops. They probably lived in huts with wooden frames covered with turfs and thatched with rushes. The farmers made tools of stone, bone, and antler. They also made pottery. For centuries the farmers and the hunters co-existed but the old hunter-gatherer lifestyle gradually died out.**

**About 2,000 BC bronze was introduced into Ireland and was used for making tools and weapons. The bronze Age people also erected stone circles in Ireland. They also built crannogs or lake dwellings, which were easy to defend.**

**Then about 500 BC the Celts arrived in Ireland. They brought iron tools and weapons with them. The Celts were a warlike people. (According to Roman writers they were passionately fond of fighting) and they built stone forts across Ireland. At that time Ireland was divided into many small kingdoms and warfare between them was frequent. Fighting often took place in chariots.**

**Then in 432, a man named Patrick arrived in Ireland. Patrick was probably born about 390 or 400. According to tradition he lived in Western England until he was captured by Irish raiders at the age of 16 and was taken to Ireland as a slave. Eventually, Patrick managed to escape back to England. However, he eventually returned to Ireland, and he was a missionary until his death in 461.**

**From 500 to 800 was the golden age of the Irish church. Many monasteries were founded across Ireland and soon the Irish sent missionaries to other parts of Europe such as Scotland and Northern England. Irish monks also kept alive Greek-Roman learning during the Dark Ages. In Irish monasteries learning and the arts flourished. One of the greatest arts was making decorated books called illuminated manuscripts. The most famous of these is the Book of Kells, which was probably made at the beginning of the 9th century. However, this golden age ended with the Viking raids.**

# Hurricane Preparation 2022

The unofficial **Florida Hurricane Season** runs from about June 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>. If you think about that, we are at risk for **HALF THE YEAR!**

During the hurricane season our lives are dominated by the constant fear that we might get hit by a hurricane. We are watching the weather closely. We are (hopefully) preparing, gathering food and water, and thinking about what we would do if a hurricane came our way. The big question is whether you would stay or evacuate, a major decision. Thinking about this beforehand should help when a storm is heading towards us!

In 2021 we were very fortunate that we did not experience any serious storms. However, history tells us that eventually we will see one. In 2017 LHV was hit by a major storm and suffered a good amount of storm damage, along with losing power. Thankfully, the damage was limited to property, and nobody suffered any serious personal injuries.

For the past several years your Homeowners Association (HOA) has supported a group, committee, or Team to address some of the planning issues and help residents through this difficult process. We call ourselves the **HOA Emergency Preparedness Team**. At the first meeting of the new HOA Board, HOA President Clark Smith announced Board support for our Team in 2022. I was asked to coordinate these efforts.

Our **Emergency Preparedness Team** accomplished a great deal in 2021. We hope to build on this success in 2022! To do so we need more members. Please consider joining us. We are all dedicated to helping our neighbors. All members are residents!

If you decide to volunteer, **YOU choose** what you would like to do and how much time you have available. We all help and support each other. There are many different things that need to be done. Last year, one of our members put together a hotel list for people who are considering leaving. Some helped to sign up people for Special Needs, which requires a short application and then filing it with County Emergency. We have divided LHV into eight Zones or 'neighborhoods.' There are about 25 homes in each Zone. Each Zone has at least one, maybe more volunteers helping to talk with people in that Zone to help those who need help. So, please think about becoming involved.

We thank those who were part of the Team in 2021.

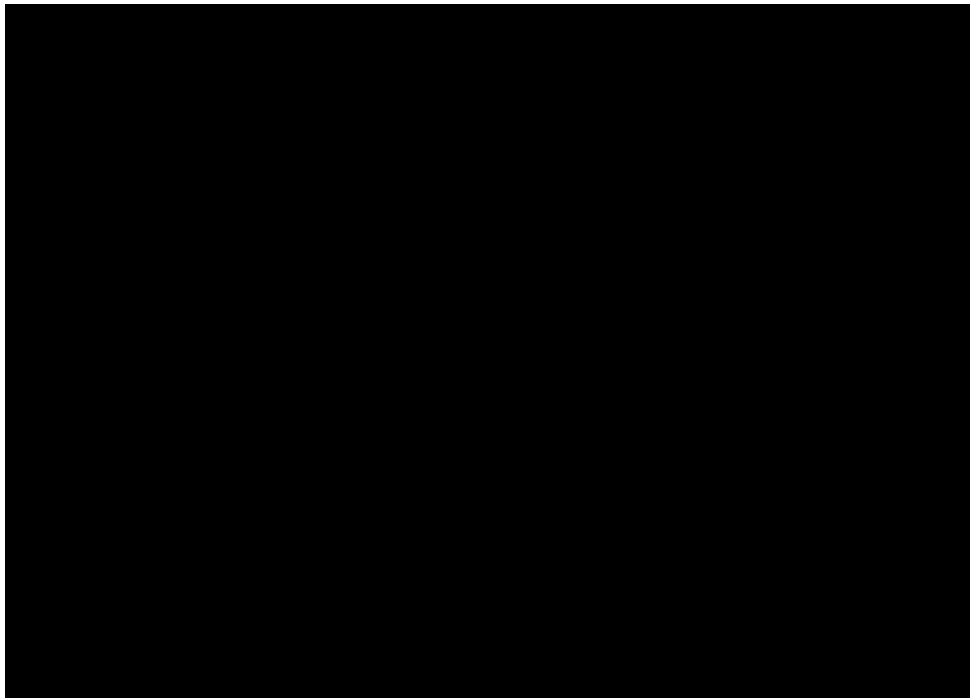

## March Space Coast Launch Forecast

- March 1, 2022 - 4:38pm An Atlas 5 rocket will launch GOES-T, an enhanced weather satellite for NASA/NOAA. Launch window 2 hours.
- March 3, 2022–9:32am Space X will launch a Falcon 9 rocket carrying the next batch of Star link 4-9 satellites for its internet constellation.
- March 8, 2022 –TBD Another batch of Star link satellites on a Falcon 9.
- March h 30, 2022 – 2:45pm A Space-X Falcon 9 rocket will launch the Axiom-1 private crew to the International Space Station aboard a Dragon 2 capsule.
- Note: NASA plans to roll out its new SLS Moon Rocket sometime in March to Pad 39B preparing it to fly on its first unmanned mission in April.

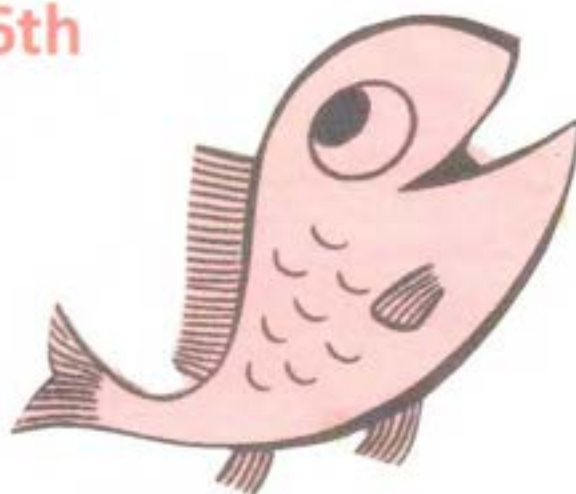

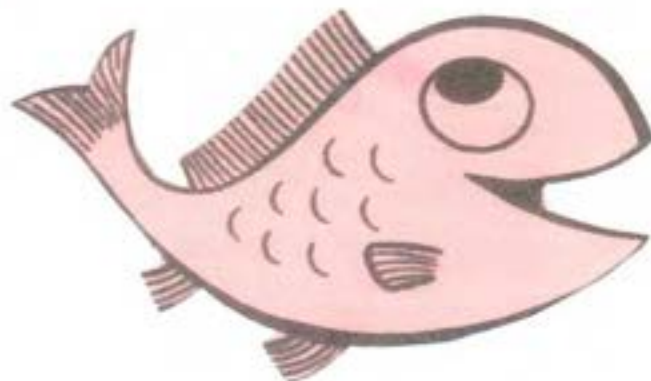

## What Do Leprechauns Have to Do with St. Patrick's Day?

One icon of the Irish holiday is the Leprechaun. The original Irish name for these figures of folklore is “lobaircin,” meaning “small-bodied fellow.” Belief in leprechauns probably stems from Celtic belief in fairies, tiny men and women who could use their magical powers to serve good or evil. In Celtic folktales, leprechauns were cranky souls, responsible for mending the shoes of the other fairies.

Though only minor figures in Celtic folklore, leprechauns were known for their trickery, which they often used to protect their much-fabled treasure. Leprechauns have their own holiday on May 13, but are also celebrated on St. Patrick's, with many dressing up as the wily fairies.
