### Board Gives Go-Ahead to HOA Emergency Preparedness Team

At the February HOA Meeting the Board gave the go-ahead for the Team to begin planning for 2024. As part of the Meeting Agenda, Dave Graham gave a brief report on the Team for 2024. He also passed out a flyer with information about the Team in hope of attracting new volunteers to add to our existing Team.

The Team will have an Organizational Meeting on Wednesday, March 13 at 6:30PM at the clubhouse. At that time the Team will review Team membership for 2024 and begin our planning. We hope that all our members will return but realize that this may not be the case for various reasons. We welcome everyone, no required time commitment, and no required lifting or heavy duty – YOU choose the time you can spare and what you would like to do. Even if you can spare one hour each month it will help us provide services to our residents. We need people to help with lists and make phone calls to follow up with residents, and other tasks, such as revising our Hotel List which is available to anyone for use as a planning guide during hurricane season, etc.

The Team goals will be dependent on volunteers available. We hope to be able to do what we did last year.

The Team will participate in the **Annual Vendor Fair** which will be held **March 20, 2024**. In 2023 we set up exhibits, gave out information, and had the opportunity to meet and talk with residents as they entered the fair.

A possible early **June Open House** will be discussed. In 2022 & 2023 the Team held this event. Last year we had guest speakers and served a light lunch to everyone attending.

We also hope to provide Hurricane Information Packets to all residents, as we have for the past four years.

The Team will also submit a Hurricane / Emergency Preparedness article to Gator Tales each month, as we have over the past four-plus years.

## Attention Snowbirds! Before You Leave......Things to Do

It is the time of year when our **Snowbirds are beginning to think about returning to their summer homes**, leaving all of us to ......'enjoy' the warmer weather.

The **Emergency Preparedness Team** suggests that you use the **Snowbird Pre-Departure Checklist** to help review and plan for a smooth transition. A copy of this form is included in this edition of Gator Tales. This checklist covers the major areas of concern. Please look this over and consider using it as a resource for your pre-departure planning.

<u>Remember.....you will be away during all or part of Hurricane Season. Your property will not receive the</u> <u>same level of care and attention when you are not here. Try to anticipate things that might become</u> <u>problems.</u>

If a hurricane threatens, loose items can fly around in high winds and cause injury or damage. <u>YOU are</u> <u>responsible for making sure this does not happen</u>. Remember, if a neighbor's house is damaged due to your failure, you may be financially responsible. Here are some checklist items to focus on:

- Remove, secure, or store away loose outside items! This applies not only to Snowbirds but to <u>ALL</u> <u>RESIDENTS</u> and is an <u>ongoing responsibility</u>!
- \* Be sure to leave keys with someone you trust to check your home at regular intervals. Do not expect these people to do extensive work on YOUR house as they must take care of themselves when a storm is coming. When this happens it is 'all hands on deck', so to speak. Be a good neighbor and prepare ahead of time.
- It is important to let the LHV Management Office know when you are leaving, provide your contact information, and your potential return date.
- \* The Team has eight Zones and representatives in each Zone. If possible, talk to a team member before you leave so we can answer any questions and are available after you are gone.
- \* Manager Phil Nespeca asked us to remind everyone that snowbirds should check their homes before leaving to see if they need to be power washed. Also, be sure your lawns are mulched and that you have a plan for maintaining your outside areas while you are away.

Snowbirds are an important part of our community. We love it when you are here and miss you when you when you are gone! We wish all of you a safe and happy journey!

## **Snowbird Pre-Departure Checklist**

Item (Note: All items are recommendations)	Comments
Landscaper	Be sure a landscaper is in place to maintain the trimming & edging of your lawn on a weekly basis. Be sure a landscaper is in place to maintain your shrubs and weed flower beds at least once per month
Power Washer	Have a vendor set-up in the event your home needs to be pressure washed.
Turn OFF Hot Water Heater Turn Off the water to your home* *but leave the sprinkler system on	If you choose to do this, you MUST turn the power off to your Hot Water Heater or you could damage your hot water heater. This could prevent broken pipes inside of your home
Sprinkler System	Set to water only times per week and no more than hour per zone. Do not set the system to water between _am & _pm Check to ensure the Sprinkler Rain Sensor is working to prevent over- watering during rainy periods.
Secure Items Outside of your home	Remove and store away any birdbaths or feeders Remove and store away any patio furniture Remove and store away any trash containers Remove and store any wind chimes or ornaments Remove any other items outside of the home that are not secure as they could become damaging flying objects Secure hurricane shutters prior to departure or make arrangements with someone to close them in the event of any potentially damaging storms.




