



# **Emergency Preparedness Team Plans Open House for Residents**

The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team met on April 7<sup>th</sup> to begin planning for the upcoming hurricane season which begins on June 1<sup>st</sup> and runs until the end of November.

At the meeting the Team reviewed the Zone Plan it developed. This plan has been reviewed in articles, **posted on our Bulletin Board**, and included in last year's information packets. Team members agreed this has worked well and will be used once again this year.

The plan includes eight Zones of about 25-30 homes. Each Zone will have several volunteers assigned to it. The Zone coverage was changed slightly. The following is the new list of Zone Volunteers\*:

#### **TEAM OPEN HOUSE PLANNED:**

The Team is holding an informal Open House on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 1<sup>st</sup> from 1:00PM to 5:00PM at the clubhouse</u>. Be sure to mark this on your calendar. - Learn about the resources available to all residents written materials and other information
- Learn about the Polk County Special Needs Program and how it may apply to you. If interested, Team Members can assist you in the registration process which just takes a few minutes
- Learn how planning ahead and being prepared can maximize your safety in the event of a sudden storm
- ➤ Consider discussing a Hurricane Plan. You are not alone. Team Members are there to help you through all aspects of this process.
- ➤ Learn about factors to consider in making a decision regarding evacuation leaving before a hurricane hits what to consider, etc.
- > Other information we are able to provide.

<sup>\*</sup> Others available if necessary; Additional Volunteers are welcome!

Meanwhile, the Team will meet again on April 21<sup>st</sup>. (Note: this article is submitted prior to that date to meet the deadline of the 20<sup>th</sup> so we can only report the main items on the list).

On the 21<sup>st</sup> the Team will use the first part of the meeting to review the radios obtained last year for use in emergencies. Team members need to familiarize themselves with use of these.

We continue to be in contact with the County Emergency Operations eOffice and other providers to obtain shelter maps and other information for all residents. At present the plan is to distribute an 'Information Packet' to everyone through the Zone Coordinators. Contents of the packet will depend on the information available, and the Team will consider adding and copying additional materials if necessary.

The Team will meet again in late April to review progress.

Remember to check our billboard in the Clubhouse for information. We are trying to update this on a regular basis.



#### The Hurricane Hunters, Lakeland Florida

With Hurricane season quickly approaching (officially starts on June 1, 2022) many Floridians do not know of the NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) assets based right here at Polk county's Lakeland Linder airport. The NOAA Aircraft Operations Center in Lakeland is home to many of the Hurricane Hunter's aircraft, including 2 heavily instrumented WP-30 Orion 4 engine turboprops that have the ability to penetrate the storms at various altitudes, scan with tail/body mounted Doppler radar antennas, deploy dropsonde sensors, and record various meteorological data. This data is then forwarded to the National Hurricane Center in Miami Florida to enhance storm forecasts that we all receive. These 2 planes have been nicknamed "Miss Piggy" and "Kermit" (with permission from Jim Henson Productions). These aircraft are typically manned by an off staff of 20+, including 3 NOAA Corps pilots, engineers, and meteorologists. Recently NOAA has also started testing the ability to launch long range sensing drones into the storm to observe lower altitude conditions. During an active storm, the P-3 Orion's will take turns flying into the storms with Air Force Reserve C-130's stationed at Keesler AFB in Mississippi.

While talking with the NOAA staff at Sun and Fun on March 9, 2022, one pilot stated that one of the P-3's was in Guam, as it is still storm season in the southern hemisphere, and the other P-3 is undergoing upgrades out of state. Crews will be returning both aircraft to Lakeland in early May prior to the start of the US Hurricane season. The NOAA operations center also uses a Gulfstream IVP jet aircraft (nickname Gonzo) to provide high altitude data, as well as several other aircraft to provide additional information and storm damage reconnaissance. The NOAA group was originally stationed at MacDill AFB in Tampa, and then moved to the new facility in Lakeland in 2017.
