



The Citizens' Academy provides residents with the information, resources, and tools to become knowledgeable community members and effective neighborhood leaders. This is a hands-on multisensory experience. At the beginning of the program, participants will be known as Citizen Cadets. At the end of the 9-week program, participants should have an increased understanding of the organizational structure and operations of the various city departments that impact the quality of life in the City of Haines City. #### **Hurricane Season Begins:**

#### Time to Get Serious About Preparing!

Hurricane Season has arrived, bringing with it almost six months of hurricane danger! This is the reality of living in Florida, whether living here full time or as snowbirds.

In June there is usually limited weather activity, so this is a great time to start getting serious about preparing for what will be coming over the next six months. So, **Think ahead. Be prepared.** 

#### **Getting Started:**

As we stated last month, our Team is preparing for hurricane season. Team activities include:

- All residents will receive a comprehensive 'Hurricane Information Packet' by the first week of June. The Team has put together most of the information you will need to be prepared. These packets will be delivered in person by one of our Zone Leaders. Team members will carry ID's lanyards with name tags. So if someone knocks at your door, ask to see their ID before talking with them. At the same time, the Zone Leader will be gathering information regarding whether you plan to stay here or leave when a hurricane is coming. This information is crucial to everyone the Team and LHV because, when a hurricane is coming, the Team and LHV management need to know who is here and who is not and who needs help. We are trying to gather as much information early this year to avoid last minute confusion. PLEASE COOPERATE WITH US. This is done in your best interests.
- □ Read the Materials! The information you receive has been carefully chosen. Please look them over and think about what you would do if a hurricane is coming.
- If you have questions at any time about anything, contact someone your Zone Leader or the Team Coordinator listed below.
- Due to lack of attendance and lack of interest, the Team has decided not to have another event in June. After discussing alternatives, the following plan was suggested by Team Member Jerry Smith:
- During Hurricane Season a <u>Hurricane Watch</u> triggers a <u>Special Team Meeting</u>. Residents will be invited to attend for information and questions. YOU WILL NEED TO WATCH FOR THIS AS IT OFTEN COMES UP QUICKLY BE AWARE. Watch for Facebook posts.
- ☐ For your information: a <u>Hurricane Watch is issued when sustained winds of 74 mph or higher</u>
  are <u>POSSIBLE within the specified area of the Watch. Because hurricane preparedness</u>
  activities <u>become difficult once winds reach tropical storm force, the Watch is issued 48 hours</u>
  in advance of the onset of tropical storm force winds.
- ☐ **Generators:** The Team will have a list of residents who have offered to share generator use if there is a power outage. Some residents have medications which need refrigeration. Cell phones and devices can be recharged, etc. **Ask us for this information.**
- Residents with Special Needs: You may need special consideration if you are on oxygen, housebound, or have other conditions which limit your mobility. There will be a summary of this in the info packets. Be sure to read this! If you have questions or think this may apply, contact one of us. We can answer questions and have application forms and can enroll you.

- ☐ Florida Sales Tax Holidays: Two periods: <u>June 1 to June 14</u> & <u>August 24 to September 6</u>; hurricane related items are free of sales tax good time to purchase expensive items or any needed supplies.
- Be sure to shop for nonperishable food, batteries, and other items now. Don't put it off. **Think ahead. Be prepared.**

#### The Risks and Rewards of Being a cop.

My entire adult life has been spent serving the people of Polk County by enforcing the law. It's all I ever wanted to do.

It's the same for a lot of people who work in law enforcement, they want to help others, they want to protect those who need protection, and lock up those who need to be locked up.

The job comes with risks, so It's not a job everyone is willing to do.

On Saturday, April 27,2024, two deputies from Polk County Sheriff's office were shot by an anti-government extremist at a park in Lakeland.

Deputies had been patrolling the area due to recent burglaries and other crimes around the park. They found the man in a parked car in the middle of the night, while the park was closed. He was uncooperative with the deputies, first by refusing to identify himself, then by refusing to step out of the vehicle.


Suddenly, the man shot the two deputies standing by his window. Three of the deputies at the scene returned fire, and the suspect was killed.

One of the injured deputies was shot twice in his right arm, and the other deputy was shot in his left, but the bullet entered his chest cavity – narrowly missing his spine and heart.

Both deputies have been improving each day, and we thank God for that.

These deputies knew the risks of the job, but they still chose to go out and put themselves in dangerous situations each day. They do it, because they love what they do. They feel good about the difference they make by doing their job. It's a very special feeling to be able to better someone's life, or to help them in a time of need.

The people doing this job are sons and daughters, mothers, and fathers. They're ordinary people doing an extraordinary job, and I am proud to be their Sheriff.




