

For the past several years we have been writing about the possibility of hurricanes and encouraging everyone to prepare. <u>Hurricane Milton reminded us of the dangers we face every day during our six month hurricane season!</u>

Our Team has worked very hard to keep focusing on preparation. <u>Hurricane Milton</u> challenged all of us. **Milton came on QUICK and hit us HARD!** And we came through it well. We are sorry for those who suffered damage to their homes. We are thankful that there were no serious injuries. Overall, we came through well.

However, as of the date of submission of this article (October 20th) there are still 41 days left in <u>hurricane season!</u> There is still time to have another storm and we need to continue being vigilant.

<u>Remember, on November 10th of 2022 Hurricane Nicole arrived here, an unusual late season storm.</u>
At that time we were lucky and only got a small part of the storm.

Remember, Continue to:

- Stay alert watch weather forecasts for possible storm danger
- * Keep your hurricane supplies handy. Don't put them away just yet!
- Watch for Team Alerts on the LHV Facebook Page
- * Utilize the information the Team has provided
- * Think about what choices you should make if a hurricane threatens us.
- * Contact a Team member if any questions

As we stated, anything can happen, and the unexpected often does! In this time of changing weather patterns and unusual activity we need to be watchful and prepared during this still dangerous time of year!

We thank the residents who took precautions and were prepared for Milton. You are all good neighbors, and our Team is an extension of our network of neighbors and friends helping each other.

Hurricane Milton Info

Milton formed from a tropical disturbance that originated in the western Caribbean Sea and consolidated in the Bay of Campeche on October 5. Gradual intensification occurred as it slowly moved eastward, becoming a hurricane early on October 7. Later that day, Milton underwent explosive intensification and became a Category 5 hurricane with winds of 180 mph (285 km/h). At peak intensity, it had a pressure of 897 millibars (26.49 inHg), making it the fifth-most intense Atlantic hurricane on record. Milton fluctuated in intensity after an eye wall replacement cycle, re-intensifying into a Category 5 hurricane the following day. Increasing wind shear caused the hurricane to weaken as it turned northeast towards Florida, falling to Category 3 status before making landfall near Siesta Key late on October 9. Afterwards, Milton rapidly weakened as it moved across the state into the Atlantic Ocean, and became extratropical on October 10 as it became embedded within a frontal zone. The remnants gradually weakened and passed near the island of Bermuda before dissipating on October 12. As of 10/17, 25 deaths have been reported due to Milton.

At least 27 confirmed tornadoes touched down in Florida before the storm made landfall as a result of a tornado outbreak that occurred between October 8–9, focused on the Florida Heartland, the Treasure Coast and the Space Coast.[[]

At Lake Hammock Village we received 8.6" of rain, and the highest recorded wind gust was 79 mph at 10:09pm on 10/10/2024. About 6 residences received damage to carports and siding and the screen fence around the lift station was damaged.






