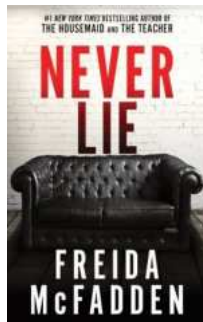

We will be discussing Never Lie, by Frieda McFadden.



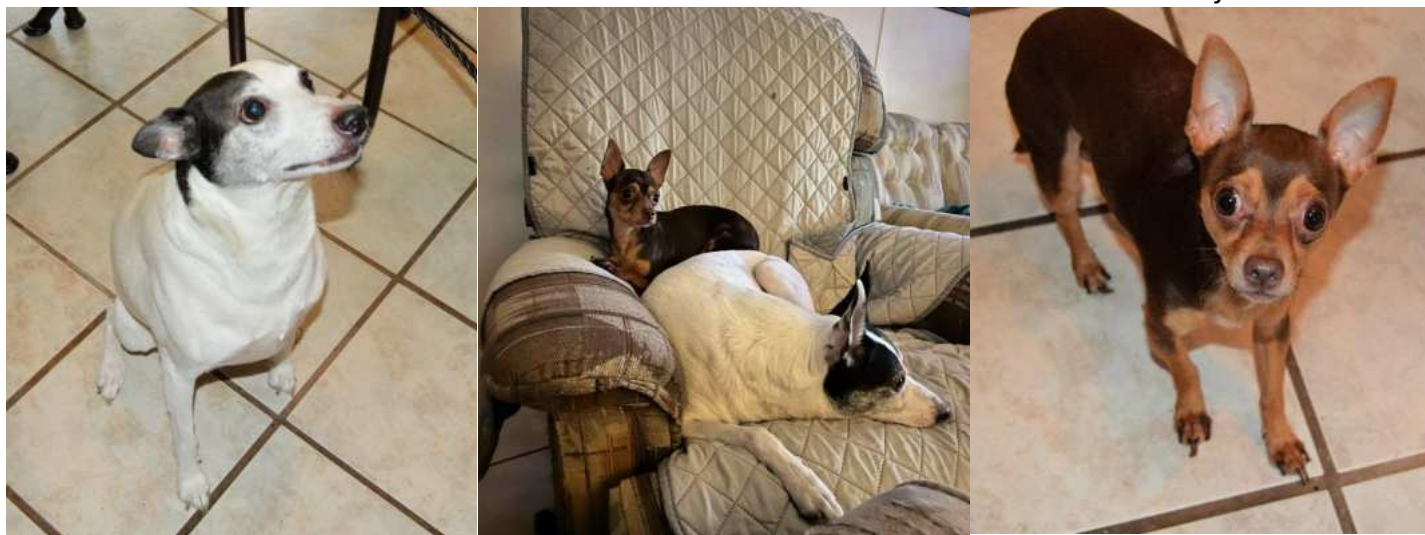

# Peak Hurricane Season is Here: Be Prepared!

As of September 1<sup>st</sup> we are now **halfway through hurricane season**. We had a close call with **Hurricane Debby** but were fortunate to get only mild wind and rain. **Hurricane Ernesto** initially looked like a possible problem, but moved off to the east away from Florida and towards Bermuda.

As we enter **Month Four** of hurricane season and move into **Peak Season**, it is time to take whatever steps are necessary to protect yourself. Storms are forming all the time, so we are sure to see more soon. You owe it to yourself and your family to be prepared.

Last month we outlined the Team's recommendations. Due to space considerations we can't repeat all of it, so please look back at the August issue for this information.

Here are a few suggestions:

- \* **Take time to look at over the information the Team has provided and think about what choices you would make when a hurricane threatens us.** Unlike minor decisions which we make every day, our decisions regarding hurricane preparation affect your safety.
- \* **Remember**, you will only have two or three days to make important decisions. Use it wisely.
- \* **You need to have a plan.** Will you 'stay and ride it out' on your own? Or, do you plan to leave? If you stay, make sure you have food supplies and that all your outdoor decorations are in a safe place, etc.
- \* **Remember: Don't rely on others! YOU ARE ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY!**
- \* Keep an eye on the weather. An excellent source is the National Hurricane Center at <https://www.nhc.noaa.gov>
- \* **When a 'Hurricane Watch' is issued, this means a storm is expected within 48 hours.**
- \* At that time our Team will schedule a Special / Emergency Meeting and post signs for all to attend if interested – also will be posted on Facebook.

**Again, refer to information previously provided and:**

- \* Be ready for anything that might happen
- \* Think about things in advance
- \* If you have questions contact a Team Member.

## Safe Stop Program in Polk

During last year's legislative session, Senate Bill 766 was passed, allowing Florida's school districts to install cameras on school buses that will capture drivers going around stopped school buses with their stop signs extended and red lights flashing.

We are excited that Polk County is one of the first counties in Florida to participate in this program, which our school superintendent Fred Heid has named the "Safe Stop" program.

We are mandated by law to provide a 30 day warning period, or education campaign prior to law enforcement issuing traffic citations to those who violate Florida statute 316.172. Here in Polk County we are giving motorists a 60 day warning period. We will begin writing tickets on September 24, 2024, as we started educating everyone recently. You may have seen our social media posts. Highly visible and reflective signs have been placed on over 500 school buses that transport kids to and from school, alerting motorists that cameras are installed on the buses. There are five cameras on each bus, capturing a 360-degree view all the way around the bus. The cameras are activated once the bus comes to a complete stop and the stop arms are extended with the red lights activated. If a car drives around the bus, a video of the car is taken, and the video is then forwarded to one of my deputies for review.

If the deputy sees a violation, they will issue a citation via the U.S. mail to the registered owner of the vehicle. The recipient of the citation has 30 days to contest the violation. The penalty for this violation is \$225.00. The monies collected are returned back to the school district for: installation and costs associated with enforcing the violations; repairs to the system; or new equipment that enhances transportation safety.

As you know, keeping our schoolchildren safe is our number one priority. Please be alert and watch for kids walking to and from school and getting on and off school buses. If we work together, we can protect kids from being harmed that school year.
