



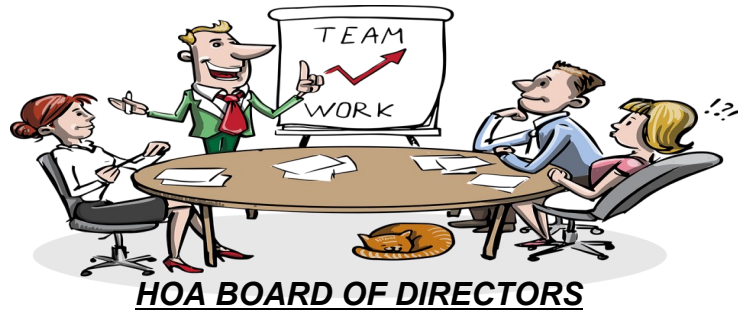
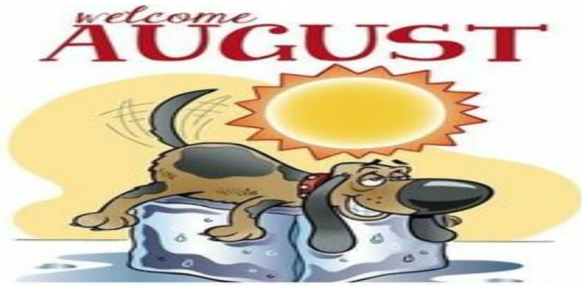

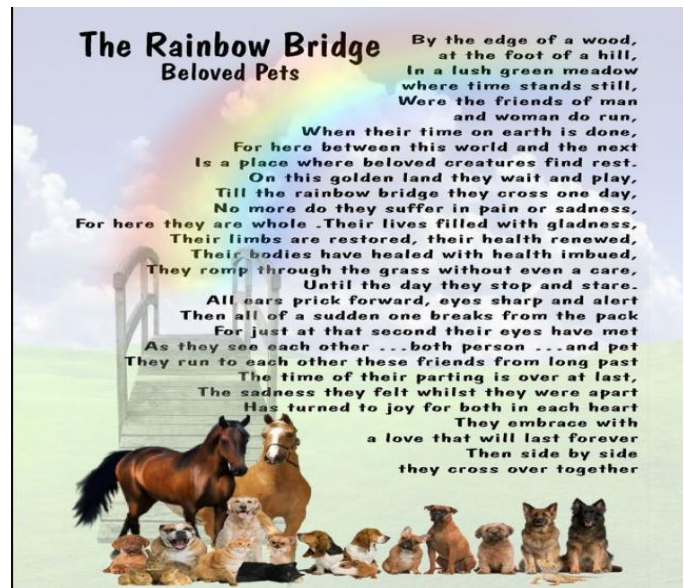

# Heat stroke

**Heat stroke signs and symptoms include:**



**Confusion or delirium.**



**Weakness.**



**Dizziness or fainting.**



**Nausea and vomiting.**



**Blurred vision.**



**Slurred speech.**



**Skin that's either dry or very sweaty.**



**High body temperature (over 104° F).**

**Call 911 immediately if you notice these signs and symptoms in yourself or someone else.**



## Important Records & Documents

- Keep copies of important family records and other documents (birth and marriage certificates, Social Security cards, passports, wills, deeds, financial, insurance, medical/immunization records, and copies of current bills) in a safe deposit box or other safe location.

## First Aid/CPR & AED

- Take first aid and CPR/AED classes (American Red Cross courses can accommodate people with disabilities - just discuss your needs when registering for the classes.)

## Inventory Home Possessions

- Make a record of your possessions - in writing or video - to help you claim reimbursement in case of loss or damage.

## Reduce Home Hazards

- Have defective electrical wiring and leaky gas connections repaired.
- Place large, heavy objects on lower shelves.
- Hang pictures and mirrors away from beds.
- Have cracks in ceilings and foundations repaired.

## New Traffic Statue May Slow You Down

On July 1, 2025, more than 70 new laws took effect in the great state of Florida.

Three days later my deputies already made an arrest for violation of a new traffic statute related to “Dangerous Excessive Speeding,” which makes driving over 100mph or driving 50 mph over a posted speed limit a misdemeanor.

The significance of this law is that law enforcement officers can place you under arrest and charge you with a misdemeanor if you violate it, which is obviously a worse scenario (for you) than having a traffic citation issue and paying a fine.

On July 4, Zachary Hall, 26, was seen driving at a high rate of speed towards a deputy who was conducting traffic enforcement in the area of Interstate 4 and CR 559 in Polk City.

The deputy pulled the speeding Corolla over after determining that it was indeed traveling at 101 mph.

The driver was also passing vehicles in a dangerous manner, which compromised the safety of other drivers and their property.

Zachary told our deputy that he wasn’t paying attention to his speed because he was eating a sandwich – that is also pretty dangerous.

When the deputy checked Mr. Hall’s criminal record he found that Hall has had three previous traffic infractions: going 73 in a 50mph zone, a red light camera violation, and failure to obey a traffic sign. Perhaps having handcuffs placed on him and being escorted to the county jail will curb some of his bad driving habits.

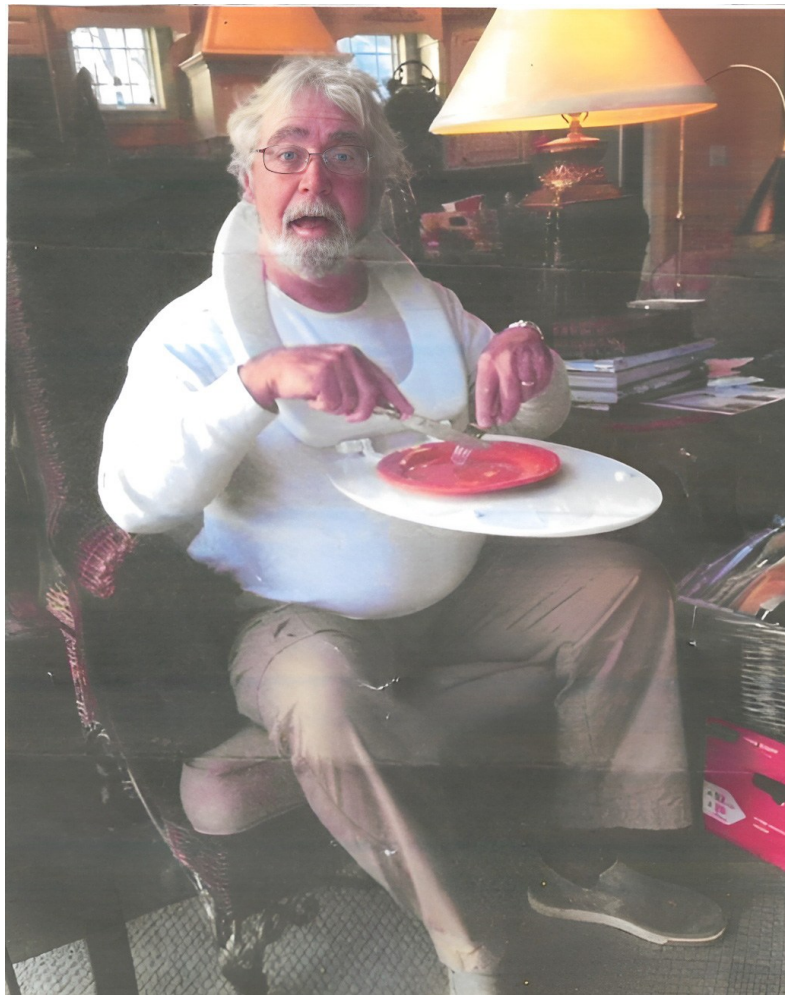
There is a reason law makers proposed and passed the bill that created this law – to discourage this kind of dangerous driving to keep people safe.

Rest assured my deputies will continue to monitor and enforce traffic laws and make arrests of those who choose to violate them.

Please educate your loved ones and ask them to slow down and pay attention to speed limits.

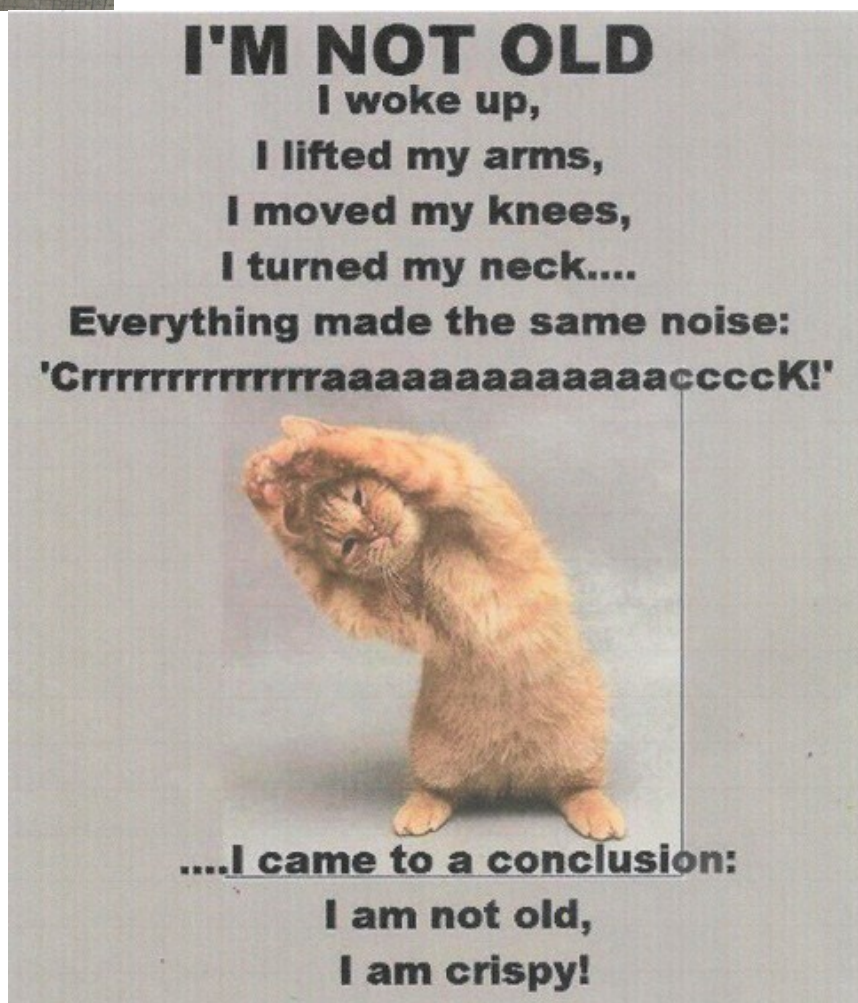
It’s the right thing to do, and it may keep them from seeing the inside of a jail cell.

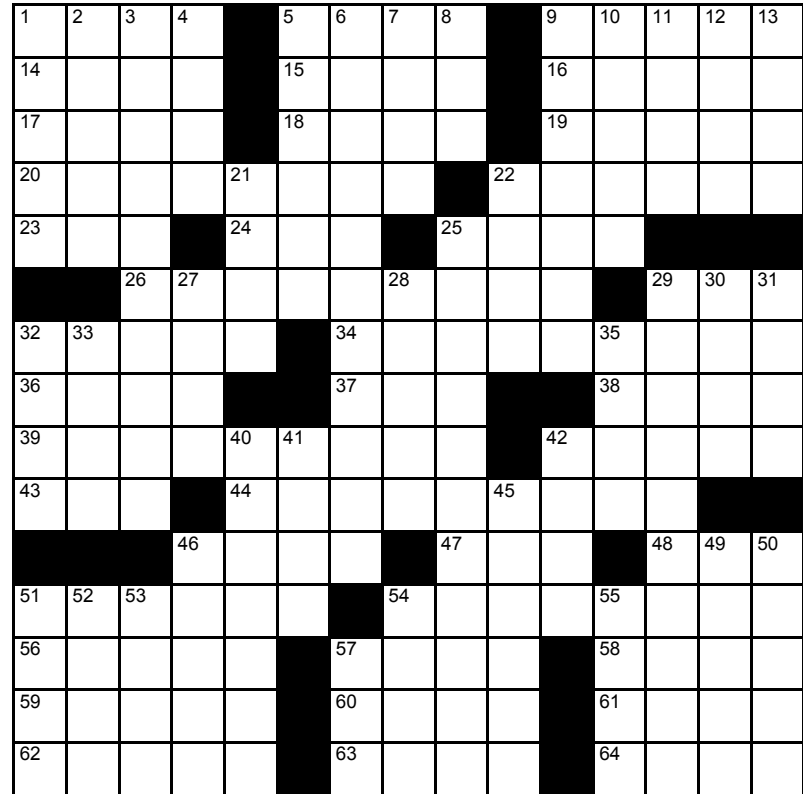

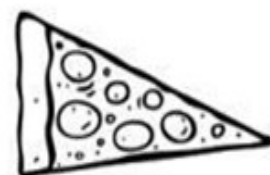

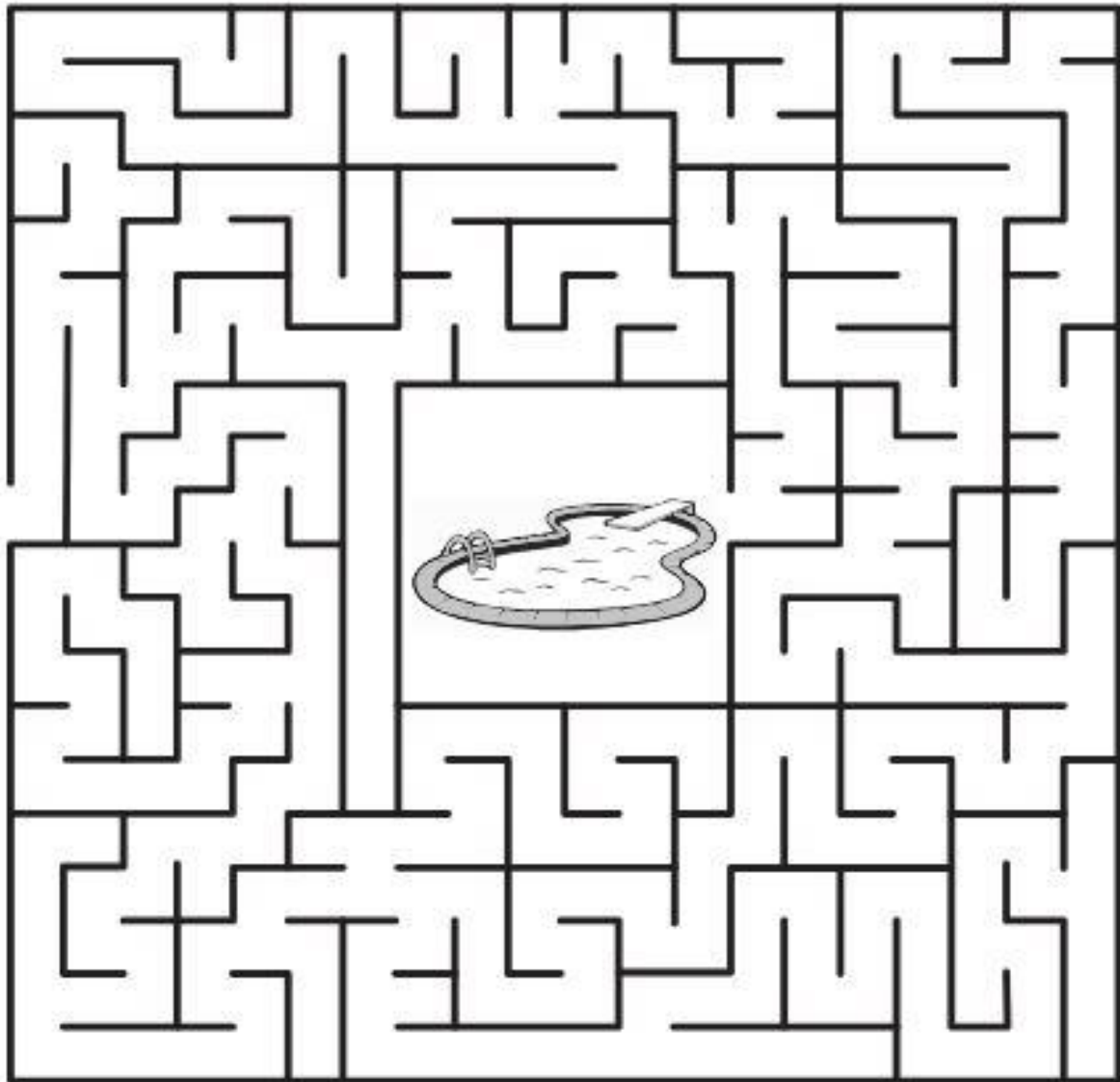
