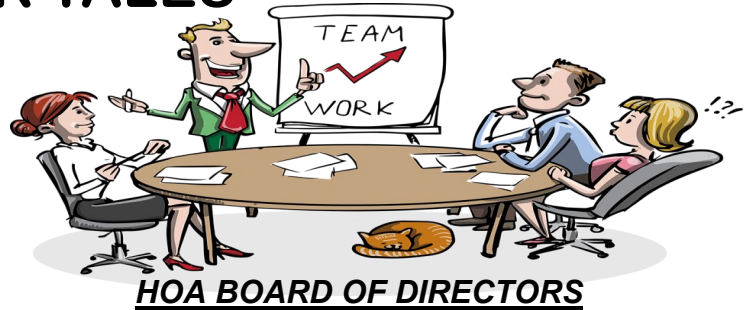

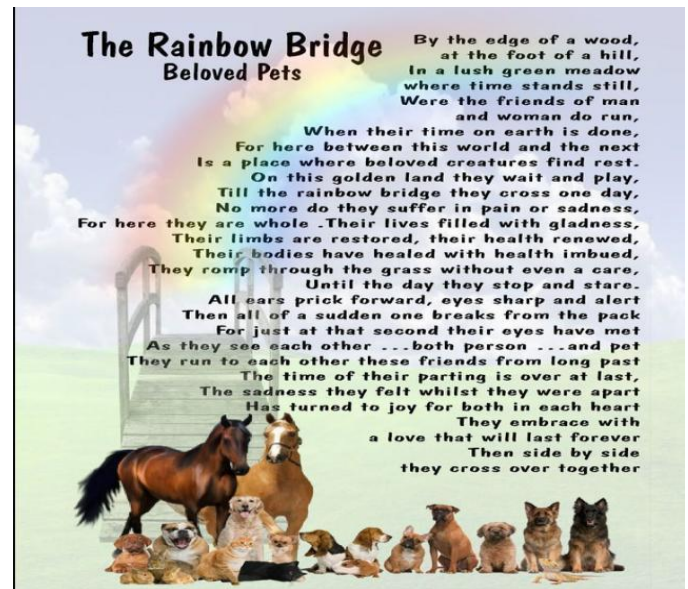

The past several months our resident Facebook page has been going a bit away from its' intended purpose and maybe this information may be a bit helpful. Several have posted that maybe the page should be deleted and how sad that would be for those of us who like the information it provides.

A little history about our site:

- The site was originally created by a resident who moved here in 2009 and wanted to connect with her/his fellow residents.
- Sometime around 2012-2014 her/his personal page was transferred to Lake Hammock Village, with a few rules and/or guidelines to help with the flow of the page.
- In February 2018 the official title of this Facebook page was changed to be "Lake Hammock Village Residents" to differentiate from the corporate community Lake Hammock Village Facebook page, since they are two separate entities. (This page is not affiliated in any way with management and/or the Lake Hammock Village HOA. Any complaints should be directed to management and not posted on the Residents Facebook page.)
- At that time, the sole moderator of this site added a couple moderators and/or administrators to help with the growing needs.

Additionally, at that time the rules and guidelines were evaluated and updated to facilitate a more diplomatic approach to our page. Those current rules and guidelines are as follows:

- **Be kind and courteous:** We're all in this together to create a welcoming environment. Let's treat everyone with respect.
- **No hate speech or bullying:** Bullying of any kind isn't allowed and degrading comments about people or things will be deleted when requested by other members.
- **No politics:** Please keep your political opinions or references off this page. Any such comments will be deleted.
- **Fact Requests:** If someone in the group requests Facebook to do a fact check on information posted and Facebook determines not all information is correct, then they (Facebook) may delete the comments.
- **Keep it LHV related:** Remember, this is our community Facebook page, not your personal Facebook page. Content should be relative to our community.
- **Residents Only:** This Facebook page is for our residents to share events, happenings and newsworthy content related to our community. To be a member you **must** reside in the community – do not send invite requests to your family members or friends who do not reside in Lake Hammock Village.

And finally, if you wish to post "anonymously" then probably what you have to say should not be posted. This site was not intended to be used for negative or anonymous comments. Management does not have access to the Residents page. Report any problems to management directly.

Florida Special Needs Registry



Welcome to the Florida Special Needs Registry

The Florida Department of Health, in coordination with its county health departments and each local emergency management agency in the state, developed a registry for persons with special needs to register with their local emergency management agency to receive assistance during a disaster. The statewide registry provides first responders with valuable information to prepare for disasters or other emergencies.

Providing as much information as possible will allow emergency management officials to plan accordingly for future disasters. You will be emailed periodically to verify the information provided is correct and to make any necessary changes.

If you are one of the following provider types, home health agency, hospice, nurse, registry, home medical equipment provider, or an end stage renal disease center, please contact SNR@FLHealth.gov to obtain a log in for the special needs registry to ensure you are able to use all the Health Care Provider Functions.

Why should you register?

- ✔ To receive important information from local emergency management officials about evacuation and sheltering options available to you.
- ✔ IT MAY SAVE YOUR LIFE!

Will my privacy be protected?

The information within the registry will only be used in the planning for and provision of emergency and/or disaster services. Additionally, Florida Statute 252.905 declares any information furnished by a person or business to the Florida Division of Emergency Management for the purpose of being provided assistance with emergency planning is exempt from F.S. 119.07 (1) and s. 24 (a), Art. I of the State Constitution. Information provided through the registry is therefore exempt from public records requests made of the Division.

High Wind Event Checklist

Shelter Safely During High Wind Events

High winds are dangerous and can hurt you. High winds can:

- Cause serious injuries and deaths
- Blow items around, such as lawn furniture or trash cans, turning them into dangerous flying objects.
- Bring down trees, large tree limbs, and power lines on people and buildings.
- Knock over mobile homes and vehicles.
- Destroy houses and buildings by removing roofs and walls

You can take action to prepare now for high winds, including tornadoes, to protect yourselves and your loved ones.

Here is what you need to do:

Prepare Now

- ☐ Plan to get inside a sturdy building BEFORE high winds hit.
- ☐ Identify a sturdy building at home, at work, at school, and near any locations that you frequent so you will be able to take shelter quickly, within minutes, if there is a warning.
- ☐ You need to get inside a sturdy building before a high wind event hits. A sturdy building is a structure with walls and a foundation. Once you have identified a sturdy building, plan to shelter in the basement or a small, interior, windowless room on the lowest level to provide additional protection from high winds.

There are shelters designed to withstand high wind events such as a FEMA Safe Room or ICC 500 Storm Shelter—find out if they are available nearby.

- ☐ Practice drills with everyone in your household, so everyone knows where to go and what to do.

Tips For Different Building Types



Mobile, manufactured homes and recreational vehicles (RVs) are NOT sturdy buildings and are not safe in high winds.

If you live in a mobile home or recreational vehicle (RV), identify a sturdy building nearby you can get to quickly. Plan to go there well before high winds hit and stay in an interior windowless room in the basement, or on the lowest level. Stay away from glass windows and doors.



If you are in a one or two-story building, plan to go to an interior windowless room in the basement, or on the lowest level before high winds hit. Stay away from glass windows and doors.



If you are in a multi-story building, plan to go to an interior windowless room in the basement, or on the lowest level before high winds hit. Stay away from glass windows and doors.

During

Take Action when a storm with strong winds is approaching

- ☐ Go to the safest nearby shelter that you have identified—a Safe Room, Storm Shelter, or sturdy building
- ☐ Quickly, get inside a sturdy building and go to the basement, or the lowest level. Then, move to a small, interior, windowless room. Stay away from glass windows and doors.
- ☐ Stay inside until weather forecasts or local authorities indicate it is safe to leave.
- ☐ If you are driving, drive to a nearby sturdy building, and take shelter inside. Do not park or seek shelter under a freeway or overpass (or trees).

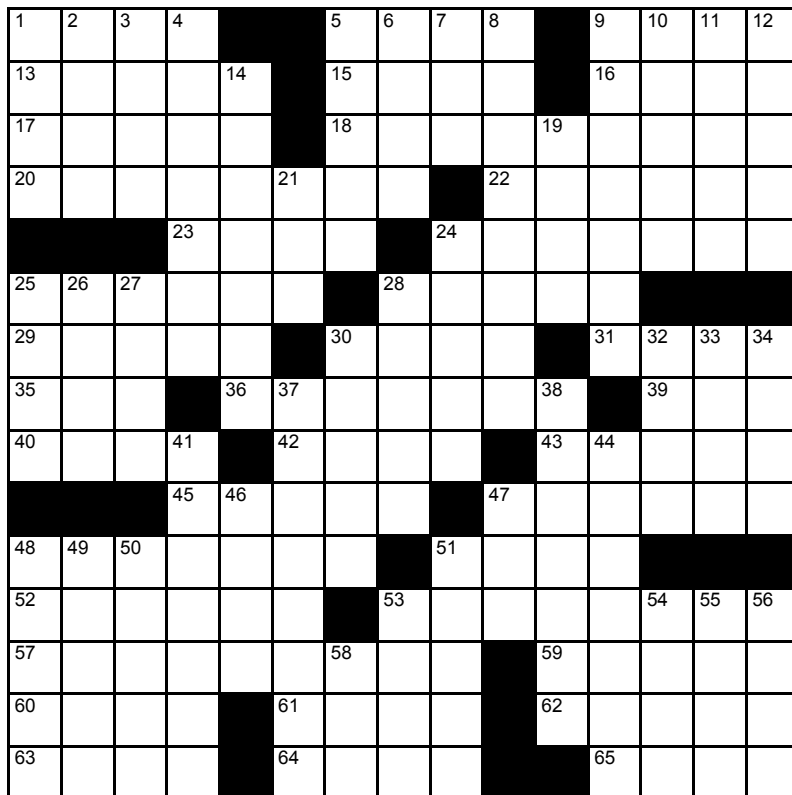
