

Florida opens new emergency response facility

AUBURNDALE, Fla. — The state of Florida celebrated the grand opening of its Central Operations and Coordination Office Thursday.

The facility, located in Polk County, has a warehouse and staging area for future storm response.

Kevin Guthrie, executive director of the Florida Division of Emergency Management, said before settling in, his team searched across Central Florida for the right location. Ultimately, they say Auburndale was the prime choice because of its price point and its location along the I-4 corridor.

What You Need To Know

- Florida opened a 421,600-square-foot Central Operations and Coordination Office in Auburndale
- The facility can house more than 300 personnel and is already 91% stocked with storm essentials
- The site replaces a smaller Orlando office and is expected to create new jobs in Auburndale while relocating some staff from Tallahassee

Guthrie says the 421,600-square-foot facility can house more than 300 personnel, 400 trailers and 100 sleeping quarters. The warehouse is also equipped with all storm essentials, including food, water, flood prevention resources and generators. The facility is already 91% utilized, with supplies stacked from the ground all the way to the roof.

"This is something that we did not necessarily have — this kind of capability in the past where we can go all the way to the roof, so that's really where we've gained a lot of space on our cubic volume versus our square foot," he said.

[&]quot;We can get to all places rather quickly from this area," he said.

TROPICAL WEATHER TERMS

A non-frontal tropical weather system with thunderstorm activity that maintains its organization for 24 hours or longer

A weather system that the NHC is interested in collecting specializes data about; does not correspond to any likelihood of development into a tropical cyclone

A disturbance that is not yet a tropical cyclone, but poses the threat of tropical storm or hurricane conditions to land areas within 48 hours

A tropical cyclone that has maximum sustained surface winds of 38 mph or less

TROPICAL STORM

A tropical cyclone that has maximum sustained surface winds ranging from 39-73 mph

HURRICANE

A tropical cyclone that has maximum sustained surface winds of 74 mph or greater

Polk County Sheriff's Losses

This past month of September has been a painful time for many members of the Polk County Sherriff's Office. There are two PCSO deputies who died in the line of duty in the month of September: Sergeant Ronnie Brown in 2009 and Deputy Matt Williams in 2006, who was killed alongside his K-=9 DIOGi.

On September 28, 2006, Deputy Williams and DIOGi responded as backup on a traffic stop. The suspect had fled the scene, and while Matt and DOGi were tracking through thick woods in West Lakeland, they were ambushed by the suspect and killed. Matt was shot nine times: DIOGi was shot once.

A short time later, the suspect shot another deputy in the leg and then went into hiding in the woods. The suspect was found in the woods the next morning and was fatally shot when he refused to drop his gun. Deputy Matt Wiliams was only 39 years old, and DIOGi was three.

On August 30, 2009, an inmate at South County Jail started acting violently in his jail cell and broke a sprinkler head. The inmate refused to calm down, so detention deputies entered the cell to restrain him. At that time, Sgt. Ronnie Brown was shoved backwards by the inmate, and Ronnie's back was seriously injured. The injury required surgery, from which Ronnie would not recover. On September 8th, a little over a week after he was injured, Ronnie died at the age of 48.

I'd like to wrap up by also mentioning Deputy Blane Lane. Blane was killed in the line of duty on October 4, 2022, but the reason I bring him up now is because the person responsible for his death was just held responsible for her actions that caused Blane's death. ON September 11, 2025, a Polk County jury convicted the suspect of 2nd Degree Murder, and all the additional charges she faced.

The deputies who serve and protect the people of Polk County do so with integrity, bravery, and compassion. It's my wish that they will never suffer an injury or perish during the performance of their duties. But know that if that should happen, the Polk County Sheriff's Office will never forget their service and sacrifice.




