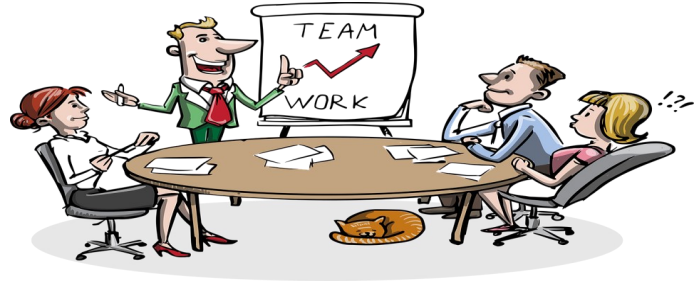

The Nest

Our front door slammed open and shut many times over the years, but there was one summer it was silenced, the summer before the last of our three children left for college. Christine, John, and Jeff had been fun to raise and the delight of my life. Even the thought of them leaving home felt empty. One day, I noticed a mother bird feverishly making a nest on the light fixture by our front door. Twigs and debris were scattered on the ground underneath. Somewhat anxious brown eyes peered quietly over the edge at me. From that time forward, the front door was off limits. Through the entire active summer, with two kids home from college and another one preparing to leave, everyone used the kitchen door. Soon, the nest burst into activity with the arrival of three little birds. We were able to watch from the kitchen as the mother bird fed and fluffed her babies, cleaned out the nest, and eventually taught them to fly. And then one day, they were gone. I thought about the mother bird and how her care and tending had ended as the birds flew away, leaving nothing but a nest. From the moment I counted the three birds, I began identifying with the whole process; so, I carefully took the abandoned home down from its perch and placed it on a shelf in the garage. As I watched Chris, and John, and now Jeff pack to leave home, I wept, realizing the inevitable had come; I had raised my family, and it was time for them to apply all the lessons home had taught them. Late in October of the same year, an unusually loud thunderstorm hit our area. I looked out the kitchen window at the sky, and a movement caught my eye. There, huddled under the eaves by the front door, near the porch light, were three fledgling birds. I'm sure it was "our family," returning to find shelter in the only place they knew for sure was safe, familiar, welcoming, because it was home.

Smiling, I returned to my breakfast, knowing I'd been given reassurance. Though the years of nurturing were over, the years ahead would bring many opportunities for sheltering our family: When the crisis, the frightening, the difficult, or the overwhelming times come, there is one place that will always be safe, familiar, and welcoming for my family— home. Our hope should be that our children, to the fourth and fifth generation, will be able to have a home to come back to.

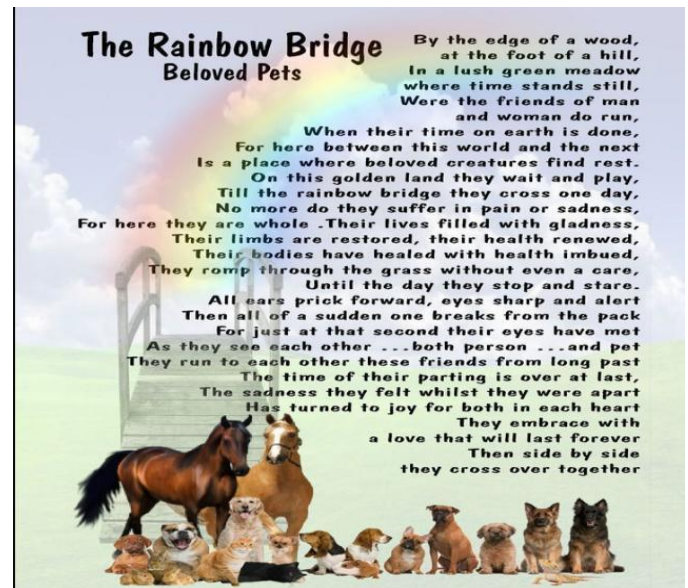

National Forensic Science and Crime Analyst Day

September 14-20 marked National Forensic Week when we recognize the behind-the-scenes professionals who play a vital role in solving crimes and keeping our community safe. At the Polk County Sheriff's Office, we're proud to highlight two outstanding units: our Forensic Investigation Unit and our Identification section.

These teams are the quiet force behind many of our successful investigations. Our Forensic Investigators respond to crime scenes across Polk County, collecting evidence, taking measurements, and photographing scenes with precision and care. In 2024 alone, they worked more than 1300 crime scenes – each one requiring attention to detail and a commitment to uncovering the truth.

Once evidence is collected, our Identification Section steps in. These specialists operate out of the Sheriff's Operations Center and focus on fingerprint analysis. When prints are recovered from a scene, they compare them against criminal databases to identify suspects. In 2024, this team performed an incredible 148,474 latent fingerprint comparisons. Their work has helped solve countless cases and secure convictions that might otherwise have gone cold.

We also recognize another group of unsung heroes – our Crime and Intelligence Analysts. September 20 was National Crime and Intelligence Analyst Appreciation Day, and we're proud to celebrate the analysts who support our investigations with data, trends, and actionable intelligence. Their work helps us track, map, and anticipate criminal activity, allocate resources effectively, and stay one step ahead of those who seek to harm our community.

These professionals may not make arrests, but their impact is felt in every case we solve and every life we protect. Their dedication, expertise, and tireless work behind the scenes make Polk County safer every day.

Please join me in thanking our forensic investigators, identification specialists and crime analysts for their incredible service. We're proud of their work, and we're grateful for their commitment to justice.

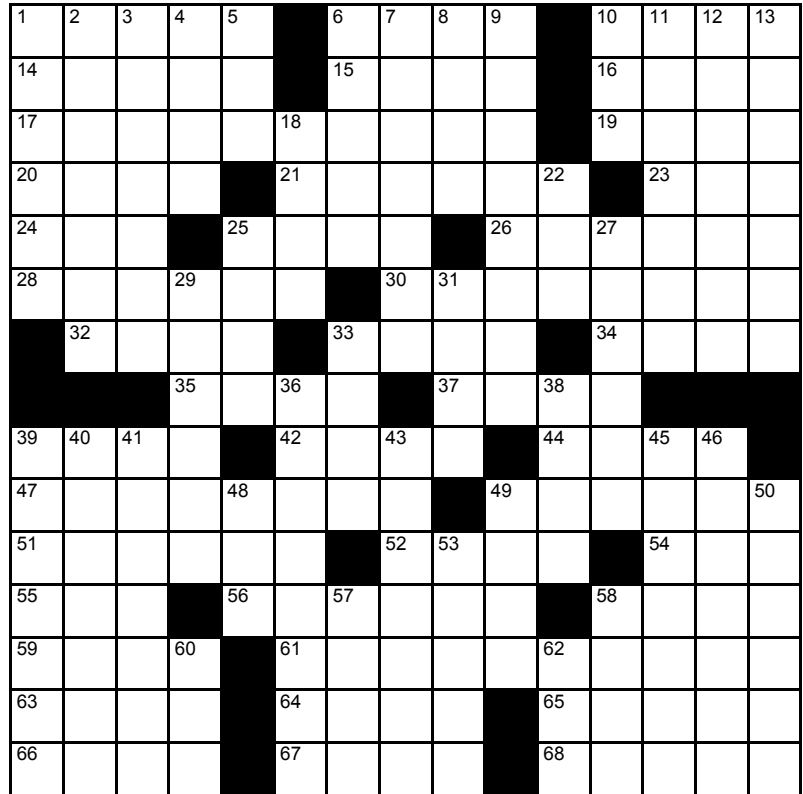
