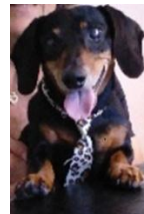


## The Rainbow Bridge Beloved Pets

they cross over together

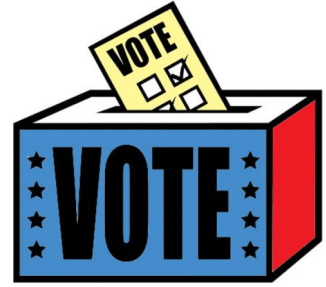

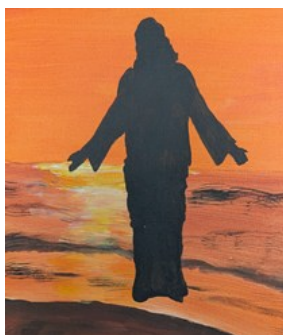
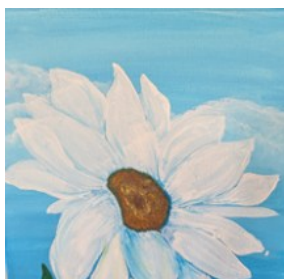

### **Adopt a pet Today!**

At the Polk County Sheriff's Office, we believe every animal deserves a safe, loving home. That is why our Animal Control Section works hard with our animal rescue partners every day to rescue, care for, and re-home pets across our county. If you are thinking about adding a furry friend to your family this holiday season, I encourage you to adopt, not shop.

The Animal Control Facility offers the community an opportunity to adopt a deserving pet six days a week. There are dogs and cats of various sizes and breeds, all needing a "fur-ever" home. We invite you to visit the facility and find the pet that can become the "beacon of unconditional acceptance" for you.

Animal Control is located at 7115 De Castro Road, in Winter Haven, just off County Road 540. Hours are 10:00am to 4:00 pm.

The adoption fees are as follows: Cats and kittens are \$40.00; Dogs over 35 lbs. are \$40.00; Dogs under 35 lbs. are \$70.00. Seniors also get discounts. The animal will be sterilized, vaccinated, and microchipped, and checked for any worms, fleas, and other parasites.

Our Animal Control team does more than adoptions. They respond to calls about stray or aggressive animals, investigate neglect, and abuse, and educate the public about how to care for pets safely and responsibly. Their work is essential to keeping Polk County safe for both humans and animals.

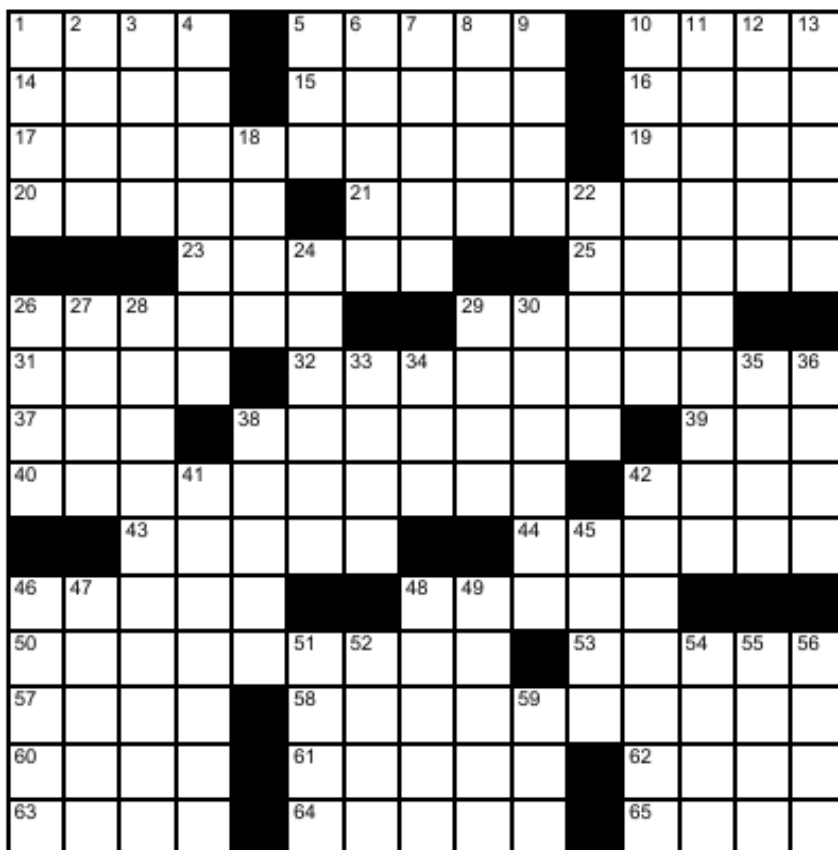

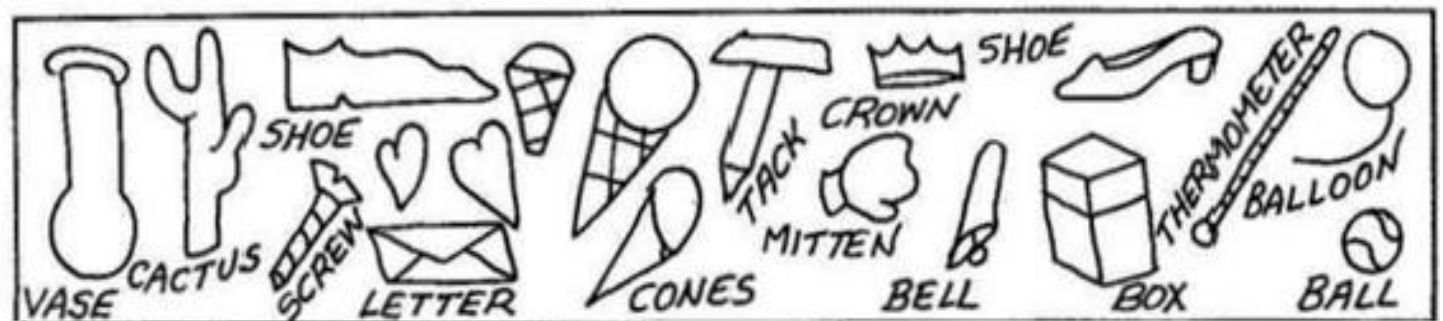
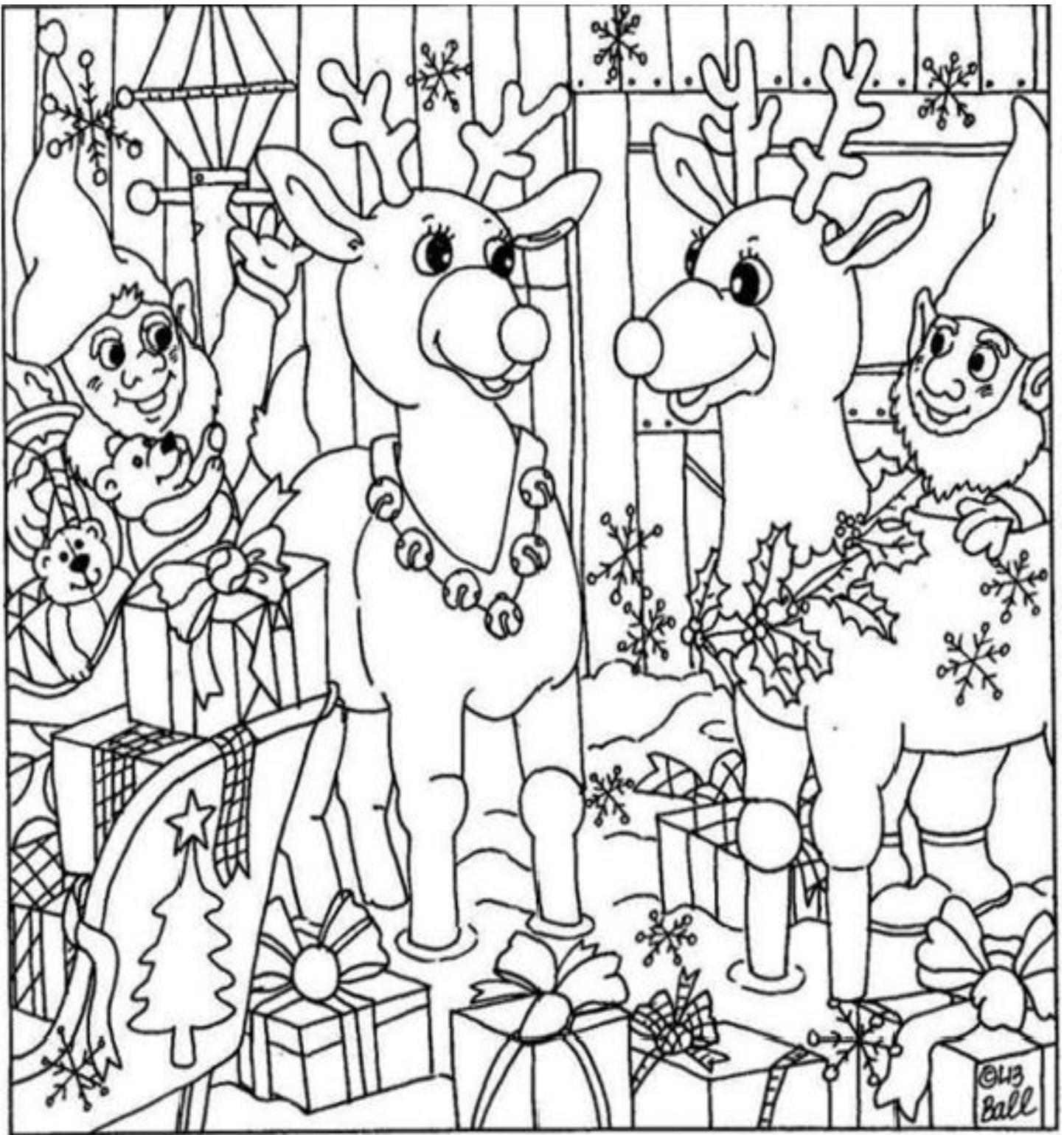
